Common Questions Related to UKG Syllabus

What is the Age for UKG Classes?

The correct age for UKG is between 4-5 years. Though there will be certain relaxations in upper age limit in most of the schools

Who Releases the UKG Syllabus?

In India, the educational authorities have the authority to release the UKG syllabus for the 2023 academic year. The four major boards in India that release these syllabuses are the CBSE, ICSE, Cambridge board, and state boards. These boards are responsible for determining the curriculum and learning goals for children in the UKG grade in India, and the syllabus they release serves as a guideline for teaching and learning in UKG classrooms across the country.

What are the learning goals for children in UKG?

In UKG, children should be working towards the following learning goals:

1. Developing reading and language skills, including the ability to read words and sentences aloud
2. Engaging in social conversations and interactions with others
3. Using a range of tools and activities, such as flashcards, oral interaction, written work, worksheets, storytelling, and enactment, to explore their creativity
4. Reviewing and reinforcing their English language skills.
